The History of the Maternidad de Maria

Bishop John Wright of Pittsburgh began the mission in Chimbote, Peru in the 1960s. Several priests, including Father James Shanahan, Msgr. Jules Roos, Fr. Gerald Lutz, and Fr. John Price were the pioneers who went to Chimbote to found the mission. They were joined by Sisters of Mercy and the Vincentian Sisters of Charity.


The Center for Social Works, which is the focal point of the Pittsburgh mission operations in Peru, first opened as an outpatient clinic. In 1966, Msgr. Roos decided to open a maternity hospital, where mothers could have their babies in safe, clean, comfortable surroundings. He was joined by the Dominican Sisters of Grand Rapids, Sr. Margaret Mary Birchmeier and Sr. Lillian Bockheim.

An earthquake in 1970 seriously damaged the hospital, which at the time performed prenatal monitoring, infant care, and postnatal care. In 1984 the hospital reopened, caring for an average 10 to 12 births a day. With the help of the mission partners in Pittsburgh and across the country, Msgr. Roos equipped the facility with new technologies.

Today the Center for Social Works has become a regionally recognized multi-service health and education facility consisting of a maternity hospital, an outpatient clinic, a clinical laboratory, and an orphanage. The doctors and staff treat an average of 17,000 patients and deliver 300 babies every month, offering compassionate care in a faith-filled, Catholic environment.

The Maternidad

The Maternidad de Maria provides comprehensive health care to pregnant women. The maternity hospital offers gynecology, obstetrics, and pre-natal, delivery, and post-partum care. More than 88,000 babies have been born since the facility opened in 1966.



The Clinic

The Outpatient Clinic provides medical consultations, minor surgery, injections, first aid, as well as treatment for tuberculosis, asthma and malnutrition. Nearly 800 patients per day, or 300,000 per year, receive care in the health clinic.



Home Visit

The Social Works Ministry serves the poor by visiting the homes of those too sick to go to the clinic. Also, there are many elderly individuals who are alone and destitute, without family support. Two social workers go to the home to assess the need. Outpatient nurses provide treatment for chronic ailments, and bring medicines and supplies to treat wounds.

On a daily basis the Center provides:

- ➔ 226 maternity visits
- ➔ 148 lab visits
- ➔ 5 births
- ➔ 7 emergency visits
- ➔ 10 physical therapy visits
- ➔ 49 ultrasounds
- ➔ 4 home visits
